#### **Call Committee News**

The purpose of the Call Committee is to identify the candidate who is best suited to accompany the congregation into God's future. The work of the committee is that of discernment. Therefore, the work of the committee must be done prayerfully, and the people on the committee must be open to the movement of the Holy Spirit. The Call Committee is not looking for the "best and brightest" candidate; rather, they are looking for the "right" candidate for this particular congregation. Please listen to some of the details included in this task and ask yourself if that is something you are interested in or would like to encourage someone else to consider.

The Call Committee is expected ...

- To be in prayerful discernment throughout the call process, calling upon the Holy Spirit for wisdom and guidance.
- To develop a Ministry Site Profile which faithfully describes the congregation, its mission and vision, and

the needed leadership skills and gifts of a pastor or deacon to work with them toward that mission.

- To interview prospective candidates whose names are offered by the bishop's staff with the goal of finding a person who will lead the congregation in its mission.
- To check candidates' references.
- To faithfully represent the congregation to prospective candidates, describing its history, its weaknesses, and its strengths.
- To deliberate with each other throughout the process, keeping in mind the health of the congregation and its faithfulness as a part of the Body of Christ.
- To recommend to the congregation a candidate for call who reflects the ability to be their leader and their partner in mission and ministry.

It is important for the committee as a whole to understand that each individual has a bias, and to challenge each member to see beyond their own unique wants toward the greater good of the whole. Encourage one another to open their hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit moving within the Call Committee for the sake of the congregation's mission and vision.

One of the benefits and responsibilities of the committee is to build relationships with each other. Take time to learn what gifts and skills each member brings to the work of calling a minister. Because of the cross-section of people on the committee, it is likely that each will learn something about the other and his or her ministry.

The frequency of meeting depends on how the committee plans to process the Ministry Site Profile and the variables of preparing for interviewing. Meeting once every two weeks is a good baseline to consider. Each meeting should begin with devotions and prayer. Devotions should be intentional, not rushed. Inviting God into the conversation and opening one's ears to hear God's invitation are vital components to this process.

Please prayerfully consider if you are interested and able to be on this committee and let someone on church council know if you would like to have your name considered.
